

The school is a residential campus and caters to the energy needs of around 550 students and staff members round-needs of around 550 students and staff members round-the-clock, besides meeting the energy requirements of the school itself. The average total energy consumption was 68,242 kWh per month.

The school used to be solely dependent on local power supply from Rajasthan State Electricity Board (RSEB). Plans. The sources of this energy were conventional.

What prompted the change?

By and by, the management developed an acute awareness of the school's carbon footprint due to dependence on conventional sources to meet its energy requirements. An idea to adopt renewable energy to meet the regular energy needs of the school gradually took root. The school has the advantage of being geographically located in a state that basks in excellent sunlight for most of the year. Therefore, in 2007, the management planned to tab the power of the sun to meet the school's energy needs.

installation of rooftop solar panels was a daunting task, physically and financially, but the desire to switch over to a more environment-friendly source of energy was the driving force behind the school's unwavering resolve to driving force behind the school's unwwering resolve to finish the job. The funding for the installation was provided by Birla Education Trust (IBET), Plant (Rajasthan). The management of BET entered into an agreement with an agency. Sun Weres Infraower, Jaiour to pay them Rs. 4.40 per unit electricity generated for the next 25 years, since no payment has been made to the company for the

installation of the rechtop solar.

During the academic session of 2017-18, solar panels were installed on the rechtop of the school, covering an area of 5,300 source metric in total and producing more than 40,000 kWn of

shan 40,000 kWh of electricity every enorms.

The primary reason behind schools becoming more interested in the use of solar power to meet their energy needs is a desire to save money. The amount of money an individual school can save with a swatch to solar oncryp will vary depending on factors such as focation, current energy demands, type of solar power installed, etc. Although initial installation of solar panels is an expensive affair, in the long arm, after the lost promy has been counted, solar energy pays, for listel. The electricity bill is equived and the amount of meny saved every month eventually adds up to the cost of installation of solar power, and subsequently exceeds it.




CELEBRATIONS REPUBLIC DAY 2019 - RAJBHAWAN, JAIPUR


